FIRE HAZARD SCAVENGER HUNT

- 1. Overloaded Electrical Outlet: Find an outlet with too many plugs and learn how to fix it.
- 2. **Electrical Cords:** Check for cords that looks damaged or worn out and make a plan to replace them.
- 3. **Smoke Alarm:** Locate a smoke alarm in the house. Check if it's working!
- 4. Candles: Find candles and make sure they're in a safe spot, away from flammable items.
- 5. **Space Heater:** Look for a space heater. Is it too close to curtains or furniture?
- 6. **Matches or Lighter:** Identify where matches or lighters are stored (they should be out of reach of children).
- 7. **Kitchen Stove or Oven:** Check for anything flammable near the stove, like towels or oven mits.
- 8. **Escape Routes:** Find two exits (like doors or windows) in each room.
- 9. Fire Extinguisher: Locate where fire extinguishers are kept in the house.
- 10. **Clutter Near Exits:** Spot any clutter blocking doors or windows used as fire escapes.
- 11. **Flammable Liquids:** Identify things like gasoline or cleaning products—are they stored properly?
- 12. Chimney or Fireplace: Check if the fireplace or chimney is clean and clear of hazards.
- 13. **Dryer Lint Trap:** Locate the dryer lint trap. Is it clean?
- 14. **Hot Appliance:** Find a hot appliance like an iron or stove and make sure it's turned off after use.
- 15. Escape Plan Meeting Spot: Identify your family's outdoor meeting spot for emergencies.
